GUIDELINES FOR PAPER SUBMISSION

We invite paper submissions in English or Hindi from teachers, teacher educators, research scholars, and students. The abstract should be concise, ranging from 250 to 300 words with 4 to 5 keywords, and should outline the paper's objectives, methodology, major findings, results, and significant implications. Tables, illustrations, charts, and figures should be sequentially numbered and duly acknowledged. The full paper should be within 2500 and 3000 words, excluding references and abstracts. Please use MS Word, Times New Roman or Hindi Font, font size 12 with 1.5 line spacing. The cover page should include the paper's title, author(s) name, designation, institutional affiliation and address, email ID, and contact number of the corresponding author. The full original paper, along with the abstract, should adhere to the following format: Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Objectives, Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusion, Implications, and References (APA 7th edition including in-text citation). Research papers may adhere to the given themes, yet researchers retain the liberty to submit papers extending beyond these themes, provided they maintain relevance to the theme of the national seminar. Selected papers will be published in an edited volume with an ISBN upon payment of an additional fee.

Plagiarism Alert: The paper should be free of plagiarism, and a self-declaration confirming the originality of the paper is to be attached.
